<p>Eight papers were presented to the workshop and there was one documentary film. Six papers were circulated in advance and were (and are) available on the Ceelbas website.</p> <p>The papers were organised under three topics: conceptualising 'coloured' revolutions; case studies – Ukraine, Georgia and Kyrgyzstan; and coloured revolutions in international perspective. The documentary featured interviews with participants and sponsors of coloured revolutions and also included footage of the events.</p> <p>The full programme is attached.</p> <p>Nine speakers participated in the programme and there were twenty six registered attendees. Nineteen of these were post graduate students and the remainder were researchers and/or lecturers. A list of attendees is attached.</p>

3. Achievement of stated aims and objectives

Please summarise how the stated aims and objectives of the activities proposed have been achieved and how these have helped to further the aims and objectives of CEELBAS.

The papers covered comparatively and conceptually the phenomenon of coloured revolutions as stated in the proposed workshop activity. Four research students gave papers, the remainder were established academics.

Time was available for all present to socialise and make contacts. This is important for students working on different aspects of the subject who are located in different universities.

A notable element of the workshop was the presence of speakers from Europe who brought a continental dimension to the discussion and widened the range of contacts for those studying this topic.

The participants included students and lecturers in international studies, area studies, politics and sociology.

A special number of The Journal of Communist and Transition Politics will be devoted to the topic of the workshop (expected date of publication Summer 2009) and it is proposed that the most important articles will be published as a book.

4. Outcomes

Please indicate the outcomes and 'value for money' of activities carried out.

Nine papers were produced and were circulated before the workshop, thirty five people attended the workshop. A 'special issue' of The Journal of Communist Studies and Transition Politics, will include the presented papers (subject to peer review). A book is likely to result following the publication of the papers. These will constitute teaching materials for students and interested parties with an interest in coloured revolutions.

Not only did the workshop provide a focus for UK students studying the coloured revolution phenomenon, but it also provided contacts with foreign academics researching into these movements.
